On hand will be the LUNCH Ensemble, with guest artists, presenting Chapin favorites, original songs, and an original play. 
Melody Pere, Ian Leclair, and Megan Czapla graduated from Mystic Middle School and will start High School at Stonington this year.



YOUR LUNCH DOLLARS AT WORK

LUNCH is a tax-exempt charitable organization founded in 1989 by Bill Pere. Most LUNCH projects are funded through grants or specific donations. Proceeds generated by our projects are used to help hunger relief and family service efforts in Connecticut. As an all-volunteer organization, we have no administrative overhead.

More important than financial support is the involvement of kids in our programs. By showing tomorrow's leaders that their individual efforts can make a difference in the lives of others, we hope they will grow to shape a kinder, more caring future. To date, more than 1,000 kids, grades K-12 from around the state, have participated in our programs. Our shows have provided quality family entertainment for tens of thousands of people. We have produced 5 Chapin Legacy Shows, 3 Holiday Shows, 3 Steve Chapin Concerts, 5 Summer Camps, a Show by Nancy Tucker, 9 CD's, and hundreds of other concert events around the state.

In the past year, we donated \$4,000 to the new Mystic Area Shelter and Hospitality to cover two month's rent. Our annual donation to Stonington Youth Services provides milk for toddlers in the Heart to Heart program for the whole school year. We support a student assistance fund at Stonington High School, and donate to the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center, the Groton Food Locker, and many others. We also give \$1,000 each year to World Hunger Year. We added a donation of \$500 to the Shoreline Soup Kitchen, in addition to the amount raised through the benefit show in January.

RECORDING UPDATE


