That was in April, 1991, and since then, more than 1,000 kids have been involved in our various events all around the state, providing family shows for tens of thousands of people, supporting social service agencies which help hundreds of thousands of people.

Harry Chapin wrote "If a man tried to take his time on earth and prove before he died what one man's life could be worth, I wonder what would happen to this world..." . Now, on this 20th anniversary of Harry's death, we can see a small glimpse of what one person's life can be worth.

The 6th Harry Chapin Legacy show will be held on Saturday, May 5th, 7pm at Stonington High School. This will be the biggest LUNCH show yet, as the worlds of Camelot and fast food collide. Join the Knights of the Ground Round Table as they invent the Excaliburger and resist the takeover attempt by the evil Morgan Buffet and Donut the Barbarian.

Once again, students from Stonington and other area schools will join some of Connecticut's top singer-songwriters, as they present an evening of Chapin favorites and new original songs to entertain the people of McCamelot. 

YOUR LUNCH DOLLARS AT WORK

LUNCH is a tax-exempt charitable organization founded in 1989 by Bill Pere. Most LUNCH projects are funded through grants or specific donations. Proceeds generated by our projects are used to help hunger relief and family service efforts in Connecticut. As an all-volunteer organization, we have no administrative overhead.

More important than financial support is the involvement of kids in our programs. By showing tomorrow's leaders that their individual efforts can make a difference in the lives of others, we hope they will grow to shape a kinder, more caring future. To date, more than 1,000 kids, grades K-12 from around the state, have participated in our programs. Our shows have provided quality family entertainment for tens of thousands of people. We have produced 6 Chapin Legacy Shows, 4 Holiday Shows, 3 Steve Chapin Concerts, 5 Summer Camps, a Show by Nancy Tucker, 9 CD's, and hundreds of other statewide concert events

Last December, at the Holiday Show, we presented a check for \$2,000 to MASH, in Groton. This was our third donation in that amount to this new organization which has been providing shelter for families in need. When they were just getting started, LUNCH was the first major contributor to the startup effort. Similarly, many years ago, when the Sunshine Kitchen was just being formed, LUNCH provided much of the funding in the early years. We support a student assistance fund at Stonington High School, and donate to the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center, the Groton Food Locker, and many others. We also give \$1,000 each year to World Hunger Year. Last year, we added the Alliance for Living to the list of supported agencies., and we hope to add more this year. Many of the kids in the Ensemble have been with us for years. By the time they go off to college, kids may spend one-third to one-half of their life involved in our programs. But each year, we always have some new faces in the group. One of the most frequently asked questions is "Where do they come from?". We don't advertise and we don't call for auditions.

The truth is, kids just appear -- that is, "if you build it, they will come...". Most kids get involved because they see us do a show or because they have a friend who tells them about us. Over the years, we have invited kids from elementary schools to come to the studio to record songs for our children's CD's. Ledyard Center School, we've had Jackie Schwenk, Tracy Albanese, and Evan Lise join as regulars. From our summer camp program, Amanda Sergiy came on board. Others come because we've done a program at their church, school, or community group. and many arrive because they've been told by a friend or teacher that "there's this fun program going on that uses music to help people in need".

So I guess we'll just keep doing what we're doing -- and if you know anyone who might like to participate --- we'll be here.




